Our Perception of God

Exodus 34: 1-9

The LORD is longsuffering and abundant in mercy, forgiving iniquity and transgression; but He by no means clears the guilty (Numbers 14:18)

Cartoonists have a special way of representing reality through their artworks. They set up their easels in public places and many people are willing to pay a small price for humorous images of themselves.

Caricaturing God is serious business, it's not funny. Many people will easily dismiss a distorted view of who God, when we exaggerate one of His attributes. In a lot of ways when we present a distorted view of God, He is not taken seriously by those who really want to know Him. For instance, those who see God;

1. Portrayed only as an angry God, they are easily lured away by someone who emphasizes the mercy of God.
2. As a kind-hearted grandfather will reject that image when they need justice.
3. As an intellectual idea rather than a living, loving person eventually find other ideas more appealing.
4. As a best friend, often leave Him behind when they find human friends who are more to their liking.
5. As a user-friendly God, they can manipulate to do everything at their bidding.

God declares Himself not only to be merciful and gracious but also as the holy, righteous and just in punishing the guilty (Exodus 34: 6-7).

As we put our faith into action, we need to avoid portraying God as having only our favourite attributes. We must worship all of God, not just what we like. One of the hymns that I learned early in my Christian life is the hymn called *Immortal invisible* – the lyrics of the first stanza are these:

*Immortal invisible God only wise
In life in accessible hid from our eyes
Most blessed most glorious the Ancient of Days
Almighty, victorious, thy great name we praise.*

I learned to appreciate the all-encompassing greatness of God through this hymn. And so my dear friends let me remind us that, *All-powerful, merciful, wise, and just is the God in whom we trust.* May His name be praised forever!!!
