Theme 2016 & Beyond: What's next after 50 years?

Run To the Cross

Hebrews 10:28-39

It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God (Heb. 10:31).

From 1995 to 1996 my family lived in Fiji, when I studied here for the degree, Master of Theology in Pastoral Theology. Towering above the roof of the College Chapel is a Cross that lights up at night and shines the brightest on a darkest stormy night. For many years, this cross has guided to safety ships that sailed through the treacherous Kadavu passage during stormy nights, safely into the Suva harbour.

I also read that the northern coastline of Maui, Hawaii is highly susceptible to tsunami. For the people of Hana, who live along this coastline, running to the hill for safety when there is a tsunami warning is the only way to be safe. Towering above the village on this hill is a big cross placed there by the early missionaries to Hawaii.

For their physical safety, the people run to the hill where the cross is located. In a similar way, all of us need a place of spiritual safety. The question is: Why do we need a place of spiritual safety? First and for most, the Bible tells us that; "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Legally sin has its 'wages' or penalty – 'death' (Romans 6:23). The good news is, the legal demand for sins has been dealt with on the cross by Christ who "took it out of the way, nailing it to the cross" (Col. 2:14). The Bible tells us that instead of death we receive a free gift; ". . . eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom. 6:23). We run to the foot of the Cross in repentance for our sins and find God's forgiveness and are declared "free" or righteous before God (Rom. 5:1) - and receive the free gift of salvation.

The freedom we receive gives us a deep sense of *peace* with God (Rom. 5:1), because we no longer stand condemned before him (Romans 8:1). We might not like to think about the consequences of our sin will be as we face a holy God, but it is a serious thing "to fall into the hands of the living God" (10:31). The good news is, out of his astronomical love for us, the Father has provided a place of safety. He sent his Son Jesus to die so we wouldn't have to be separated from Him forever (Rom. 5: 8-10).

Because of Jesus Christ's death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead, that place of safety is available. Have you run to the cross yet?

Over many years, many students and even some staff members who have come to CLTC, have sadly never had a personal encounter with Christ. You owe to yourself to run to the *Cross* in order to avoid the ugly prospect of "falling into the hands of the living God."

Welcome to our new students!! I sincerely trust that you have been at the foot of the cross – there is room for more. God bless.
