Love One Another

For this reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge . . . and to godliness, brotherly kindness, love (2Peter 1:5, 7)

On the eve of this year's Mothers' Day celebration let me share this brief message on God's love for us.

Love is indefinite thing to most of us; we don't know what we mean when we talk about love. Love is the loftiest preference of one person for another, and spiritually Christ demands that this sovereign preference be for Himself (see Luke 14:26). Initially when "the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5), it is easy to put Jesus first. But then we must practice the things mentioned in 2 Peter 1 to see them work out in our lives.

I believe that the first thing God does is forcibly remove any insincerity, pride, and vanity from our lives. The Holy Spirit reveals to us that God loved us not because we deserve it or are lovable, but because it is His nature to do so. He commands us to show the same love to others by saying ". . . love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12)

Many times God brings around us people who we do not naturally respect or think much of; with His expectation that we exhibit His love to them, just as he has shown that love to us. This kind of love is not a patronizing love which takes away the dignity of those we need to show love to; it is God's love that recognizes the human worth in the person. This kind of love does not come overnight, we just have to consciously practice living in that love and growing into it. Some of us may have tried to force it, but we were soon tired and frustrated.

"The Lord . . . is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish. . ." (2Peter 3:9). We should look within and remember how

wonderful He has dealt with us. The knowledge that God has loved us beyond all limits should compel us to love others in the same way. I know we get irritated because we have to live with an unusually difficult person. But just think of how God has to continue to live with a very difficult person like me. If God has suffered long towards me, he expects me to accord to others the same spirit of long-suffer towards them.

In closing let me say this, neither natural love nor God's divine love will remain and grow in me unless it is nurtured. This is the work of the Holy Spirit, to enable us to nurture love. Love is spontaneous, but it has to be maintained through discipline.

During this mother's day celebration, you may feel that your mother does not deserve your love. Let the Holy Spirit spur you on to love and forgive, so that you can accord to your mother God's super-natural love.

Let me wish our Mothers: A Happy Mothers' Day Celebrations.
