Recognizing God's
Provision
2 Peter 1: 3-11

Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires (2 Peter 1:4)

I take this verse as encouraging us God's people to develop the habit of recognizing God's daily, unreserved provision for us.

The Scripture tells that we are made "partakers of the divine nature," receiving and sharing God's own nature through His promises. Then we have to work that divine nature into our human nature by developing godly habits. The first habit to develop is the habit of recognizing God's unreserved provision for us.

On many occasions, God has provided for our needs even when we could hardly afford those needs. One of the worst lies is wrapped up in our confession, "Oh I can't afford it." We speak as if our Father doesn't have our needs at heart. From experience, when a need is genuinely a 'need' and not a 'want', our Father in heaven understands it. We think it is a sign of true humility and of deep spirituality to confess our inability to connect to God's provision through faith. Every blessing God has is ours in Christ Jesus, accessible only according to his will, and through faith.

Does it really matter that our circumstances are difficult? Why should they be? When we give way to self-pity and indulge in misery, we remove God's riches from our lives and hinder others from entering into His provision. No sin is worse than the sin of self-pity, because it removes God from the throne of our lives, replacing Him with our self-interests. It causes us to open our mouths only to complain, and we simply become spiritual sponges, always absorbing, never giving, and never satisfied. And there is nothing lovely or generous about our lives.

Before God becomes satisfied with us, He will take everything of our so-called wealth, until we learn that He is our Source; as the psalmist said, "All

my springs are in you" (Psalm 87:7). If the majesty, grace and power of God are not being exhibited in us, God holds us responsible. "God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you . . . may have abundance . . ." (2 Corinth 9:8). We must then learn to lavish the grace of God on others, generously giving of yourself. Be marked and identified with God's nature, and His blessing will flow through you all the time to others.

1. NATIONAL IDENTITY (NID) TEAM - JIWAKA

This week we are privileged to have the NID Team helping us doing all the civil registration for everyone.

The Team Leader Mr. Joe said that the CONCEPT OF THE NID PROJECT is fundamental for every PNG citizen. National Planning and subsequently development requires the state to be able to identify and plan for citizens individually and collectively.

The PNG National Identification (NID) card project was launched in November 2014 and slated to become a universal ID card for all Papua New Guinean citizens. The card would contain information on births, marriages, and deaths and become ID registers. It was a joint project with the Electoral Commission, Civil Registry and the National Statistical Office (NSO).

Thank you to Registrar, Mr. Abel Haon and the Administration Team for organizing the NID Team to come.

2. CLTC HOUSING INSPECTION IS ON THIS FRIDAY.

The Staff Meeting held on Wednesday 29th was well attended and the meeting was very informative. Many matters were addressed and one of them deliberated was the housing inspection. The delayed housing inspection in the past weeks were to allow the Principal and the MET Team to communicate to us the importance of being good managers of the College property and resources bestowed to us.
