**No Salvation without
Relationship**

This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent (John 17:3)

There are two excuses we make to get around God's Law. We know that we are saved by faith and not by works, and that keeping the Law of God is work – our works. Therefore, we assume that the Ten Commandments have nothing to do with salvation. There may be rules for maintaining fellowship with Christ, but the keeping of them has nothing to do with our redemption. Salvation is a gift from God which cannot be taken away from us by anyone.

What troubles me about this is that salvation is understood as having an existence in itself apart from the active presence of Christ. But the Scriptures, if we look at them as a whole, know of no salvation apart from the Saviour. To receive Him is to be saved. To turn away from Him is to turn away from salvation because there is no salvation apart from Him. Salvation is the result of the active presence of God at work in one's life.

Adam and Eve learned this when they broke their special relationship with God. At the Red Sea, salvation for Israel was the result of the presence of the Lord in their midst. The difference between the fate of Israel and that of Egypt was simply His presence.

Over the centuries Israel learned that they could not presume upon God's presence. When they grieved Him enough, His presence withdrew. That is why Moses pled with God after the golden calf experience. He told God he would not go forward if His presence was not going with them.

Jesus wanted His disciples to understand this. On the last night before the Cross, He told them, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our abode with them" (John 14:23, RSV). His disciples' security and fulfillment were to be in the abiding presence of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit within

them. The Law of God spells out the conditions for that abiding presence. Our security truly is in God.
