Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid (John 14:27)

One person I have admired as a young pastor was Dr. Ross Weymouth. Ross' story about his personal journey as a leader is inspiring. I have personally learned so much from Ross; he was one of my role models when I first came as a young man to CLTC in 1976. I became an associate Dean of Studies under Ross in 1980. I remember he used to say to me, not to be afraid of making mistakes, because we learned from our mistakes.

This week I want to share with you my conviction about failure. I am convinced that there are many good things we can learn from failure that we could never learn from success. We could never be adequate witnesses until we have failed at some point, because the majority of people to whom we will minister will know what failure is. No person will ever be an adequate shepherd of others without having known the bitter spots in life. If we are not willing to face the Cross in our own lives, we limit our ability to glorify Christ.

When I read the story of Abraham Lincoln, I was amazed to discover that the key to his success as a President of the United States of America was his many failures. He failed at almost everything he ever tried until he became a President. He failed enough that he was no longer interested in winning but wanted to do what was right.

There is a spiritual peer pressure among Christians. It is the pressure to do spiritual things for the wrong reasons, so we can look good. This has the same moral value as sin. We must come to a place where we do what is right whether the world sees us as a success or failure. We cannot do right actions to avoid failure or rejection. We must do right regardless of

the consequences simply because it is right. Do not be afraid to fail or make mistakes if you are doing the right thing.
